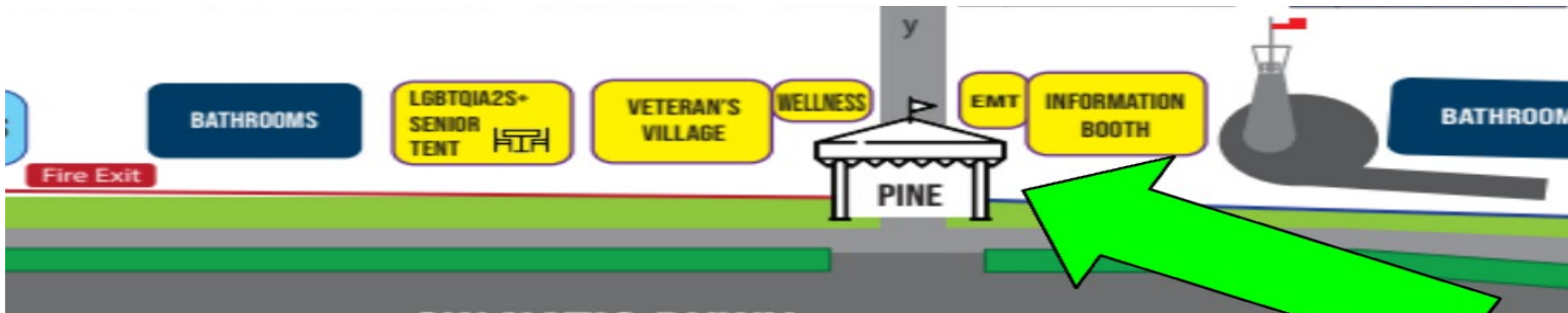
ACCESS TO THE GROUNDS

- **SW Pine Street Entrance is the most accessible for people using mobility aids.**
- Please note the Portland Pride Waterfront Festival is held in a public park, and as such the grounds can be uneven in places.
- If you need extra assistance navigating the festival, Pride Northwest volunteers will be happy to help you. You can find volunteers at the Information/Volunteer Booth in Section B, by the SW Pine St. entrance near the Battleship Oregon Memorial.

Paved entry to the park.



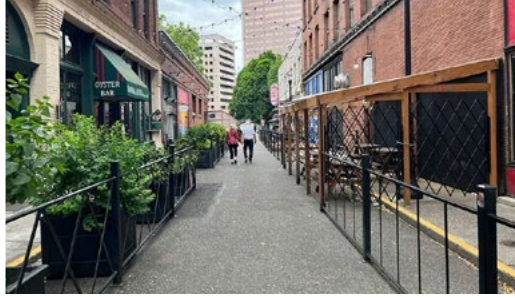
SW PINE ST

Friendly Notice: This is considered the most accessible entrance gate for those using mobility devices.



HARVEY MILK ENTRANCE

Note that the Harvey Milk entrance to the far south, has no paved entry into the park. The ground is naturally bumpy and can be uneven. **Friendly Notice: This is the least accessible entrance to the festival.**



ALTERNATIVE SPACES TO EXPERIENCE PRIDE

FOR THOSE WHO NEED IT, THE SOCIETY HOTEL AND PROSPER PORTLAND WILL HAVE ACCESSIBLE PARADE VIEWING SPOTS AVAILABLE.

- [The Society Hotel](#) has reserved a limited portion of their outdoor dining space during the parade **for Portland Pride attendees with access needs.**

- [Prosper Portland](#) has set aside space in front of their building on NW Davis St. which will be marked with signage from Portland Pride **for attendees with access needs.**
- [Ankeny Alley](#) is the first Pride satellite location, offering an alternative to the Waterfront festival. Ankeny Alley is paved and more predictably accessible. We recommend this location for people attending Pride in a wheelchair without assistance. The Ankeny Alley festival will feature strolling entertainment and music, and will be hosted on streets and sidewalks.



CENTER STAGE

- Immediately in front of the Main Stage is a seating area specifically designated for those using wheelchairs and other mobility devices.
- **The recommended route for wheelchair users** to access this area is to use the entrance under Morrison Street Bridge, navigate east to the Waterfront Park Trail, and then towards the stage. Enter through the VIP entrance next to the stage. Pride staff will provide guidance to the seating area.

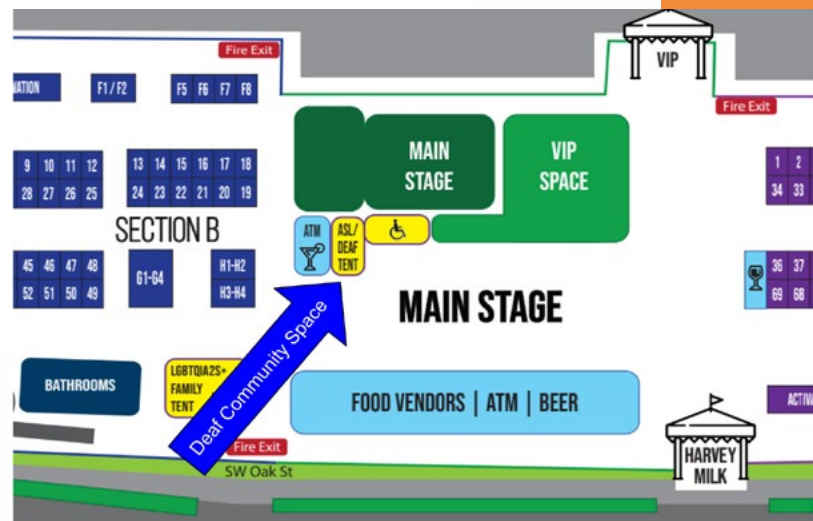
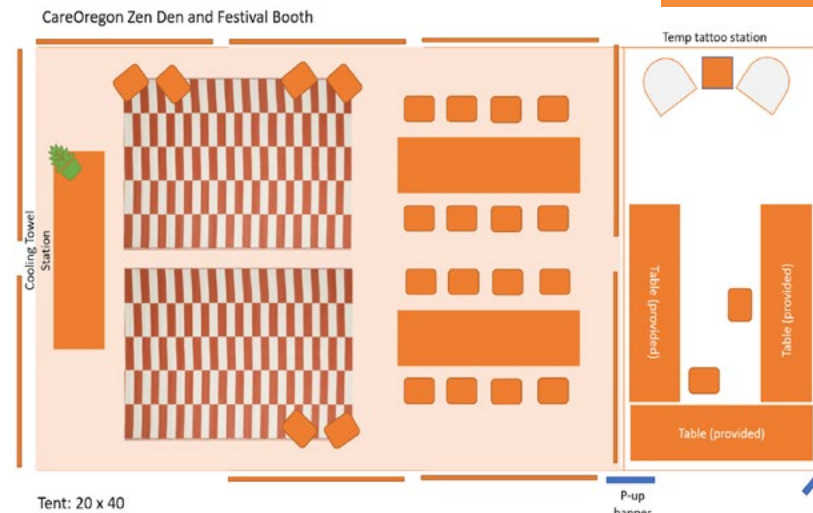
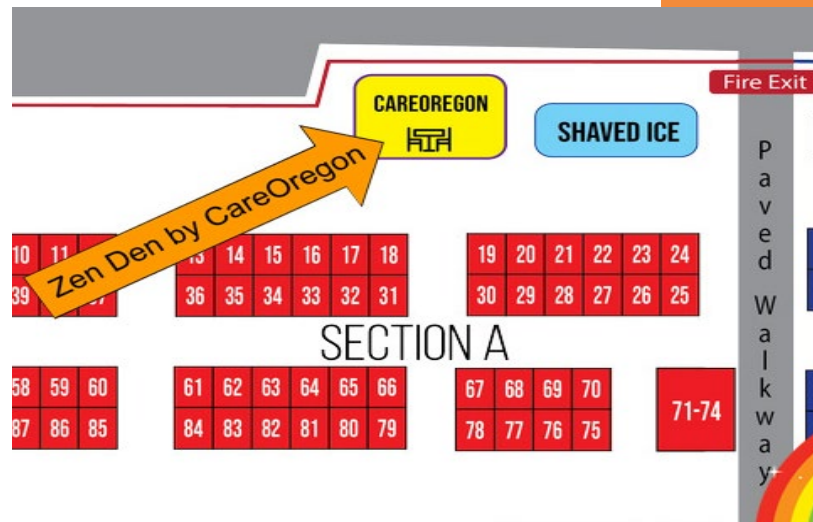
This event takes place outdoors, meaning warm weather conditions may impact sensory experiences. **CareOregon** is hosting a “Zen Den” for those who need a quieter space to decompress, relax, and cool down.

The “Zen Den” will be located on the North side of the Pine entrance, nearest to the Waterfront Park Trail.

- 30x20 space with a 10ft wide opening
- Surrounded by sheer orange curtains to create some shade and separation
- Large orange rugs
- Cooling towel station
- Tables and chairs
- Snacks and water
- Calming music

FOR DEAF/HOH VISITORS

A Deaf community space will be present east of the festival, north of the Harvey Milk entrance by the Main Stage. ASL Interpreters will be present during the event.
